



St. Lawrence Island Potential Storm Impacts

Coastal Flood Warning

IMPACTS:

- High water is expected to begin Friday afternoon and remain through Saturday.
- Water may impact areas up to the dump in Gambell and can also impact the runway, community boat storage and equipment on the runway.
- For Savoonga, this can cause erosion near the Native Store and housing in the vicinity
- There may be beach erosion along the road to the dump.
- Strong winds will develop by Late Friday Morning.

What to Expect:

Water levels: About 3 to 8 feet above the normal highest tide line.

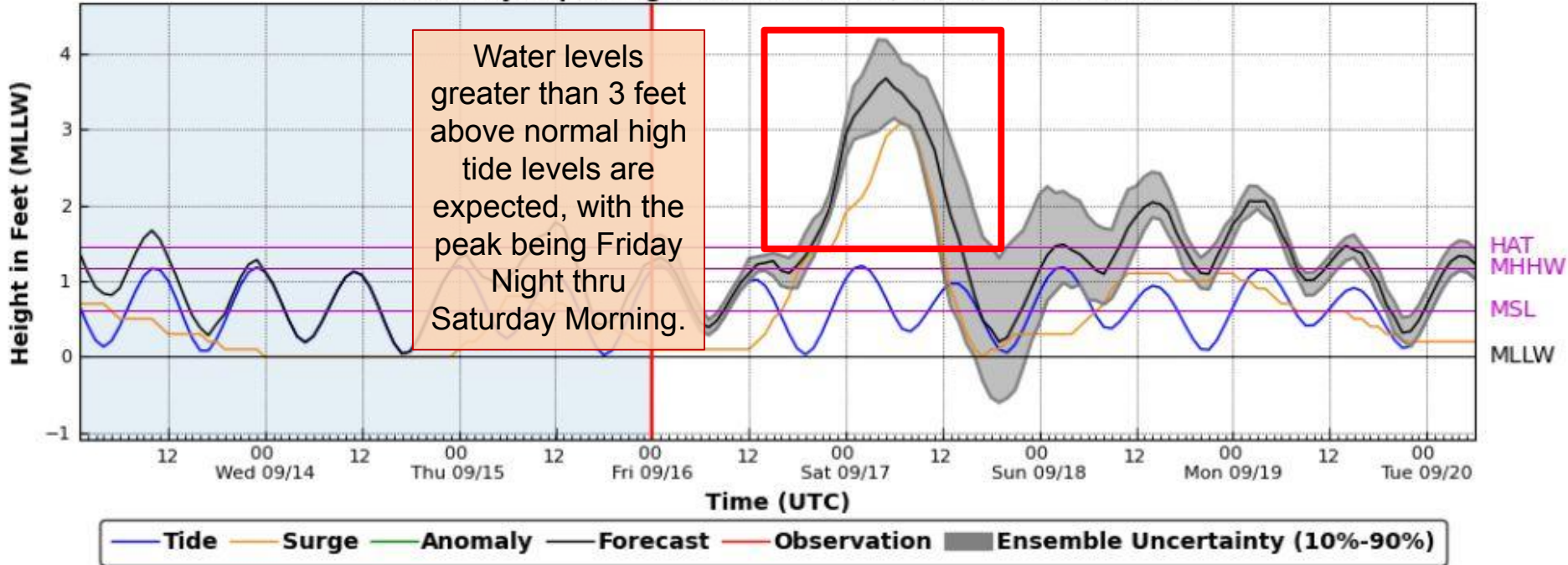
Timing: The highest water levels will occur Friday Eve. thru Saturday Afternoon

Winds: South winds 50 to 60 mph with gusts as high as 90 mph
